ABOUT LITERACY GRANTS

As part of Phi Kappa Phi's mission "to engage the community of scholars in service to others," grants of up to \$2,500 are available to champion literacy initiatives.

HOW TO APPLY

Go to PhiKappaPhi.org/Literacy to access an online application and review submission instructions.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The definition of literacy should be considered broadly.

Proposals may be for new projects or for support of existing projects. Project directors must reapply each year to receive funding, and they must be active Society members.

Target groups may include preschool children to adults.

Budget can be used only for supplies and materials, publicity, postage, etc. No salaries or stipends included.

ELIGIBILITY

Open to campus chapters and active individual members for projects relating to literacy.

Members should feel free to consider literacy either as a basic skill to be taught to those in need or as a set of expanded skills including math, computers, and more.

Chapters or individual members may consider either starting a literacy project on campus or in the community or contributing in some way to an existing literacy project. Duration of the project may be either short-term, one-time activity, or a longer ongoing series of activities. Please refer to the Literacy Grant application for suggestions on the range of possibilities that may be considered.

DEADLINE

Submit your completed application online no later than April 1, 2014, at 11:59 p.m. CT. Recipients will be announced by June 1, 2014.

ABOUT THE SCHOLAR AWARD

Once per biennium, The Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi Scholar Award honors an individual who demonstrates the ideals of the Society through their lifelong activities, achievements and scholarship. The awardee receives a \$1,000 honorarium, an active-for-life membership and a recognition citation. First presented in 1974, the Scholar Award recognizes excellence in teaching, research and public service.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Chapters and active members are eligible to nominate one individual for this award; self-nominations are accepted.
2. Although nominees are often faculty members at colleges and universities, a chapter or any active member may nominate an active Society member who is not institution-affiliated provided all criteria are met.
3. The nominee must be an active member with current dues paid as of February 15, 2014.

SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Distinguished record of past scholarly achievements.
2. Documented evidence of national or international prominence and visibility.
3. Demonstrated consistency of excellence in teaching and/or service.
4. Distinguished record of honors, publications, patents, inventions or other types of recognition for excellence and scholarly achievement.

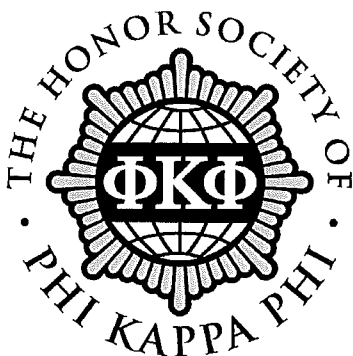
DEADLINE

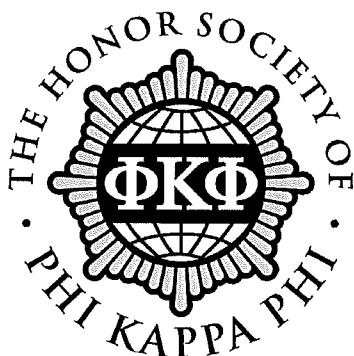
1. Distinguished record of past accomplishments in the arts (visual arts, performing arts, applied arts, and humanities).

4. Acknowledged by peers in the field through national and international awards of other means of recognition.

DEADLINE

All materials must be submitted to Society Headquarters on or before February 15, 2014.

ABOUT THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

Once per biennium, The Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi Distinguished Service Award honors an individual who has provided sustained, non-compensated volunteer service to others beyond the realm of academia.

HOW TO NOMINATE

Society members and others are encouraged to submit nominations for the Distinguished Service Award (only one nomination per person). Self-nominations also are accepted. Nomination packets submitted to Society Headquarters must include a completed nomination form, a letter describing the sustained service and evidence of the impact of the service, the nominee's current CV or résumé, and 1-3 letters of support.

ELIGIBILITY

1. The nominee cannot be a sitting Phi Kappa Phi board member, regional vice president, member of the Distinguished Service Award committee or Society employee.
2. The service cannot be part of the nominee's job description or position.
3. The service cannot be the sole donation of money to a cause or organization.
4. The service can be performed by a non-U.S. citizen and conducted in any country.
5. The nominee must be an active member with current dues paid as of February 15, 2014.

SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Distinguished record of dedicated, sustained service over many years to one or more causes or organizations.
2. Demonstrated involvement of the nominee's participation in the service activities.
3. Evidence of demonstrated impact of the service.

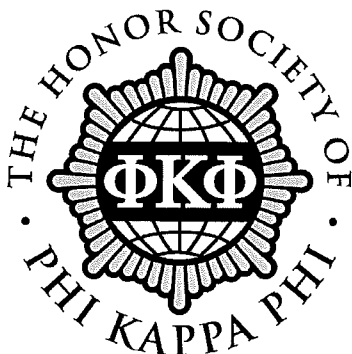
DEADLINE

Completed nomination packets must be submitted to Society Headquarters on or before February 15, 2014.
